RAYS OF LIGHT

Gardeners in Idaho have been tilling the soil a very long time. Idaho joined the National Federation in 1954 and Mrs. Ralston was the first Pacific Region Director in 1954. Idaho just celebrated our 70 Pacific Region Convention, but we were joined the region 85 years ago. Because of World War I and then II, there were several years no convention was held because of the war.

This month we honor two Idaho Garden Clubs celebrating over 65 year anniversaries: They are the Clearwater District: Moscow Garden Club and the Southeast District: Roberts Town and Country Garden Club.

The Southwest District: Golden Garden Club is celebrating their anniversary too! Enjoy the highlights of two of those clubs below:



The **Moscow Garden Club (MGC)** was organized in 1949 for the prime objective of “bringing some class” to the Floral exhibits at the Latah County Fair. For 15 years the MGC belonged to the Washington State Federation of Garden Clubs.

Our current focus includes plantings or sponsorship donations for education, community gardening and beautification, the Latah County Fair, scholarships, food bank, and McConnell Mansion, to name a few. We proudly support a Blue Star byway marker and a grove of tree peonies in the UI Arboretum.

We recently published a book including oral histories of gardening in Latah County since WWII “Born with a Hoe in my Hand”.

Our club has three NGC Flower Show judges and a number of Master Gardeners. We have sponsored an NGC Flower Show School. MGC currently holds an annual spring plant sale and have done so since 1974. Members gather in December for our annual wreath workshop and wreaths/swags are delivered to area Care Centers and member shut-ins.

Golden Garden Club Originally called the Syringa Garden Club. Jr. they were sponsored by their mother's garden club in east Boise. They joined the State Federation of Garden Clubs in 1953. In addition to their home gardens, they canned, exchanged recipes and established public gardens in the city and at the Mountain Home Air force base. Some were "Rosy the Riveter" during the war. GGC was honored with a cake and cupcake tree by the Owyhee Garden Club at the Southwest District's fall meeting. Beautiful and delicious!

GGC has continued with their contributions to the community gardens. Several years ago, along with other participants, GGC renewed Capital Park. It has brick walkway, planters, lighting and beautiful flowers in red, white and blue. It surrounds a Blue Star Memorial Monument. We continue to maintain this lovely addition to downtown Boise. Do come and see it!

Golden added to our garden, a soothing place of respite for the residents and their families, at Valley View Retirements Garden Plaza. Every fall we make bouquets with the residents. We always look forward to this opportunity to spend time with the residents.

In fulfilling our obligation to encourage young people in their knowledge of horticulture we contributed \$500 to the Boise Urban Garden School. Very recently, we contributed \$500 to the Botanical Garden which was a "triple match". This program is to provide transportation for school children to visit the garden and learn from their expert staff.

One of our most educational outings was to the Parma Fruit Expo, at the U of I extension farm.

The research they are doing in growing previously unavailable fruits in Idaho is amazing!

Revising your club Bylaws is massive undertaking, but we are thrilled and relieved that they were unanimously approved in October and include a most helpful procedure guide.

REPORTS FROM CLUBS

The Chinden Gardeners are growing! We now have 15 members and are well on our way to meeting our goal of 25 before our first anniversary. Our club is becoming more organized and we plan to begin working on our Constitution and Bylaws as it is a requirement for each club.

August was a busy month as we began the labor on our grant project. We pulled large grasses, dug up rocks and laid drainage lines to clear way for the Garden City Department of Works, Parks and Facilities who repaired and installed the irrigation system for the planters. We then amended the soil and checked the irrigation system to determine if everything would be watered properly. In September we made the final selection of plants and purchased them from our local nursery. There were several "planting days" with participation of every club member who was able to help. In early October mulch was added. The project turned out beautifully and fits nicely with the Garden City Library's new patio and children's reading area. Four members have volunteered to maintain the garden throughout the year. We were very thankful to have the strong arms and the knowledge of



drainage systems that our male members who helped lay pipe, life heavy bags of soil and plants and made our individual plant signs. Our plants have all received name tags that includes their botanical name, species, and common name. We will be purchasing signage that will show that our club planted and will maintain the planters, that we are a member of the Garden Clubs of Idaho, Inc. and that funding was received from the Idaho Horticultural Society.



Through this project we have been able to develop a good working relationship with our city government and our community. Finally, the holiday season is upon us and our Program committee has a Holiday Flower Arranging program plan where we will raffle off the arrangements to members and in December we plan a potluck dinner. Come join us, won't you?

The educational booklet, **“Ecology Warriors”** prepared by the Environmental Concerns/Conservation Committee for use in the classroom, in youth groups and at garden club meetings, was recommended and approved by the NGC Board of Directors at the 2014 Fall Board Meeting to be distributed to all members.

Editor's Rant

Recently I had an opportunity to participate in a fish stranding study with US Bureau of Reclamation and Idaho Department of Fish and Game fisheries biologists and volunteers with Trout Unlimited. The decrease in river flows is done to fulfill irrigation, flood control, and fish/wildlife needs. Simply put, we went out onto the Boise River below Anderson Dam as the Bureau of Reclamation decreased river flows from 1,600 to 300 cfs in two separate events about 3 weeks apart.. Over 12,000 stranded age-0 rainbow trout were counted in dewatered portions of the channel as well as in larger pools and side channels. It was evident to me the impact human activity has on the environment. Water is life! Here are a few more thoughts to ponder – it was announced this week by the Associated Press/US Geological Survey that Idahoans use more water, 168 gallons of water per person per day, than any people in any other state. The national average is 88 gallons per day. This was appalling to me, a former Water and Soil Resource Conservation Manager and Educator.

Ponder that the theme for our President this year is “Choices Matter – We all Live Downstream”. So you ask, what does this have to do with gardening? Recall only last year, many of us had our water usage decreased by our Irrigation Districts because of lack of water. In my neighborhood, we were put on odd/even days and none on Sundays. Know what, EVERY garden in our

subdivision looked better with this water schedule – homeowners were not overwatering any more.

With all of this pondering going on in my head, it made me think of what plants are in my garden that I could replace with plants with much lower water requirements, and thought I would share a few resources should you feel so compelled to use less of Idaho’s water as well.


The Nezperce Garden Club 2015 Calendar is now available for purchase.
